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Synopsis

When college coed Saruul takes a temporary job as a clerk in a sex shop, her pokerfaced indifference makes her the perfect foil for the shop's clientele, who range from slightly sheepish and cautiously curious to downright perverse. But it's the shop's flamboyant, eccentric female owner who initiates Saruul's journey into adulthood – taking her under her wing, teaching her the art of living, and gently guiding her on the path to self-discovery. This joyfully quirky, "candid big-city coming-of-age story" (*Variety*) from Janchivdorj Sengedorj, "one of the best voices of contemporary cinema in Mongolia" (*Asian Movie Pulse*), is fueled by a splendidly original script, utterly unique characters and unexpected encounters.

Director's Statement

I think an artist spends his lifetime searching for their inner person. So, with this movie, I simply tried to put my inner person out there. I tried expressing it with the characters of Katya and Saruul. There is no manual for life and it is impossible to have one, in my opinion. However, you are the writer of your own book, the life.

Katya lives in the past while Saruul lives in the future. Although Saruul is studying for a major pure out of her parents' pressure, she accepts her future and living towards it. Katya lives in her past, which she can't let go of. But, there is no present time for both characters. So, the conflict is their encounter in the present. There is no past because it is gone and there is no future as it has not arrived yet. But we have present time only.

Everybody asks that why I choose sex shop on this movie's plot point. It is very simple. It has been thirty years since Mongolia transitioned into democracy. In that sense, new things and concepts are even newer in Mongolia. Sex shop is not a topic freely discussed back home, so in this movie, it is just baited to lurk an audience.

For example, if a baby is given a choice of candy with a regular wrapper or a flashy one, the kid will likely to go after the flashy one. Just like that, if Katya was an owner of a grocery store, I don't think the audience would have been flattered with the idea.

Also, I think the topic of sex is relatively sensitive, not freely discussed not only in Mongolia, but all over. I am not suggesting to talk about it freely as if an evening broadcast of political news. We all know that face to face, live communication is getting less and less. We are getting behind screen and communicating in the cyber space. We are loosing live communications. Sex is not just about reproduction. It is the essence for live communication, relationship.

I really love the music; thus, I personally really focus on the choice of the music of my films. The main character has no one, no friends, but she had music. She had music and earphone only. She communicated with her music. Music is wonderful art. It expresses everything from sadness, to happiness, to heartbreak. But the scariest thing is that music encourages loneliness. Through my search for a music that expresses the inner world of Saruul, I chose Dulguun, the Magnolian.
