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SYNOPOSIS

Wolves in the Snow begins with the news that Antoine has been cuckolding Lucie for years. A violent marital argument ensues resulting in Antoine's death. After lying about Antoine's whereabouts, Lucie discovers his secret life of gangsters, money laundering and violence. Followed, threatened and badgered by the gangsters, Lucie becomes trapped by her deceit. The body of Antoine disappears, other corpses appear, and the money, very quickly, becomes only the pretext of an alarming turn of events, in which Lucie learns how to lie, to live, and perhaps also to like. Wolves in the Snow is an intense drama set against the backdrop of Montreal.

ABOUT THE PRODUCTION

Wolves in the Show is like a game played by two people. If you stretch a rubber band too much, you know that it's going to break. But you're tempted to go all the way – even if you hurt yourself when it snaps. You wait for the breaking point that will change the way you see things.

In this desperate game of hidden power, this fight that Lucie and Ruben engage in is the very heart of the story. They confront us with ultimate and hopeless power struggles. Lucie sinks into madness, and realizes that she has become the object of everyone's desire. She plays, resists, manipulates and tries to get away from this deadly game, even if it means that she loses herself in the process. She now knows that you can't find freedom and happiness through a life of sacrifice. You must seize or steal happiness. The film is built upon this concept. The determination to survive, and to escape her troubled fate reveals new emotions to Lucie. Ruben pushes her to show her best side, even though he is like a cancer eating away at her soul.

With each new ordeal, the rubber band gets shorter, and it is more and more difficult to finish the game without making sacrifices.

This film stems from a desire to return to thrillers. It is an original story being that it takes place in its own unique universe. It is neither an affirmation nor a demonstration, it speaks about emotions; those which are the strongest and most direct within this violent relationship with life, others, love, and conventional rules. Therefore the camera shall skim over the characters in perpetual motion. It shall search, surprise, embrace the faces, the regards, and catch their truth... Try your luck, endlessly, because this is life, and that's all we've got.
