FULL SYNOPSIS

"100-year old Lovebirds" Byong-man Jo and Gye-Yeul Kang, have been inseparable companions for the past 76 years. Living in their small home by the river, they wear traditional Korean clothes, go shopping at the local market, have picnics with neighbors, and enjoy dance parties. Every night they go to sleep holding each other's hands. Observing this fragile couple for 15 months, director Moyoung Jin acts as a fly-on-the-wall, capturing their twilight days with tender moments that reveal simple acts of affection – from a good-natured leaf fight to a gentle caress of the cheek.

A blockbuster in its native Korea, where it would go on to become the country's biggest independent film of all time, MY LOVE, DON'T CROSS THAT RIVER presents an unforgettable story of true love that transcends both generations and cultures.

Moyoung Jin has been making different styles of documentaries for Korean Broadcasters since 1997. As a producer, director, and writer, he has contributed to numerous films including "50 Days with Narcotics Investigation Officers," "Pioneer Resource Field," "The Life of Papers," "Urban Pigeons' Dream of Coexistence," "Mud Flat of Winter," "Asian Primitive Tribe Expedition Trilogy," "Eriyan Jaya Trilogy," and "Romantic Korea."

In 2012, he produced the feature film SHIVA, THROW YOUR LIFE which was directed by Lee Seongkyu whose MY BAREFOOT FRIEND was shown in IDFA 2010. MY LOVE, DON'T CROSS THAT RIVER is Moyoung Jin first feature-length documentary as director.

ABOUT "THE 100-YEAR OLD LOVEBIRDS"

Byong-man Jo, who is 98, and his wife, Gye-Yeul Kang, who is 89, are known as the "100-year old Lovebirds." They profoundly love each other and still fall asleep holding hands. Wearing colorful traditional South Korean clothes, they express their love passionately, drawing a heart over their head and saying "I love you".

They have been living together since 1938, after Jo was hired by Kang's parents to work in their small smith shop. Her parents allowed them to get married, so they could use him as free labor, but it was a good opportunity for Jo, who had lost his parents at an early age and had no place to live.

In those days, it was customary to get married at an early age, but out of respect for her, they only became intimate after 3 years into their marriage. She is still deeply grateful of his admirable gesture. They had 12 children but lost 6 to measles, and to this day, they still mourn for them.

Jo, as seen in the film, had difficulty hearing and communicating with his wife, often going to the hospital.
