LOGLINE

Ghanaian-American Sarah is all set to abandon her Ivy League doctoral program to follow her married lover across the country when her mother dies suddenly and makes her the owner of a neighborhood bookshop in the Bronx.

SYNOPSIS

'Queen of Glory' is the story of Sarah Obeng, the brilliant child of Ghanaian immigrants, who is quitting her Ivy League PhD program to follow her married lover to Ohio. When her mother dies suddenly, she bequeaths her daughter a Christian bookstore in the Pelham Parkway section of the Bronx where Sarah was raised. A follow-up on the classic immigrant's tale, Queen of Glory provokes laughter and empathy, as its heroine is reborn through her inheritance.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I chose to tell this story because both I, and Sarah Obeng, the main character, are tenacious. We both also exist in the hyphen between African-American. I grew up watching American movies that documented the Black American experience and I also grew up watching the movies of Nollywood, but the subject matters rarely crossed over (save for in Coming to America). There seemed to be only two ways of being Black and I wasn't quite either of them. But there was no time for existential crises, there was rent to figure out. So I graduated with a relatively useless Ivy League undergraduate degree and while my friends went into finance, I decided to pursue acting. And pursue I did. I spammed every casting director in New York, attended every cattle call, maxxed out my credit card to attend pay-for-play sessions with agents and managers who never followed up. I did everything around acting except act. But I would not be told 'no.'

Sarah Obeng also hates a 'no.' She is stubborn, insistent on a fresh start with her boyfriend in Ohio, and is willing to delude herself repeatedly and painfully to get there. What Ohio represents is an escape from her past: her unhappy parents



and her middle-class Bronx upbringing where she grew up surrounded by Ghanaian immigrants, but always feeling like an outsider.

Queen of Glory is about Sarah Obeng confronting her past when everything falls apart, enduring the pain that follows, and allowing herself to be surprised— even delighted— by what she finds there. I had no idea how much endurance would factor in realizing this film. And how much endurance would matter in 2021, when the creative team and I decided this film was ready for the world.

I thought the world needed this story because I simply hadn't seen it anywhere. West African stories don't quite fit in the boxes western audiences want to fit them into. In Asante culture— my parents' culture and that of Sarah's parents, depicted in Queen of Glory— great joy and celebration can exist right alongside pain and loss. Asante stories show life as a symbiosis of drama and comedy, each stepping in when the other swells too wildly, needing to be checked.

My producers and I initially wanted to make this film when we needed it desperately— we needed to see ourselves, to actualize, to nurture nascent careers. Then success beckoned, and perhaps, in the dead of night, we might have tried to convince ourselves that we didn't need this film anymore. But we did. Tenacity reared her head: the need to grow, to withstand, to finish what we started. After a hiatus, we all invested financially and reinvested emotionally. We finished it for ourselves, we finished it for those who couldn't, and we are so proud of it.

It started innocently enough: with two actors putting their heads together to start a production company and make projects where we didn't feel sidelined because of our race/gender/ethnicity. Our dreamy ideals were challenged almost immediately by the 'no's of investors and production partners, but we were tenacious. This, above all, is a New York story-- the neighborhood in the Bronx where my family owns a Christian bookstore was particularly integral for its vibrancy. For me, coming off the train in that neighborhood is cinematic to the point where when I'm walking down the block I look over my shoulder for cameras because it feels like I'm on a set. That essence was so important for us to capture in the film-- that that energy should be another character. When all was lost, the spirit of New York infused our hustle and we rolled our sleeves up and got creative. We bootstrapped and figured out a way-- in true immigrant fashion!-- to finish this film, and we are so proud of each other and what we made.

Nana Mensah is a Ghanaian-American writer, director, producer, and actress. Upcoming, Mensah will star in Queen of Glory, which she also wrote, produced, and directed. Queen of Glory will premiere in the U.S. Narrative Competition lineup at the Tribeca Film Festival on June 15, 2021 as a part of their Juneteenth programming. This film also marks Mensah's directorial feature debut. On August 20, 2021, Mensah will appear in a series regular role opposite Sandra Oh and Bob Balaban in Netflix's upcoming six-episode half hour comedy series *The Chair*. This



Fall, Mensah is attached to reprise her role in the Off-Broadway play Nollywood Dreams. Most recently, Mensah was a staff writer on Season 2 of Random Acts of Flyness at HBO and is currently staff writing on Amazon's The Power. She also co-wrote and co-starred in Season 2 of Netflix's Bonding. Previous film credits include: IFC's Farewell Amor (which premiered at the 2020 Sundance Film Festival), Like Father, The King of Staten Island, and the upcoming A24 film After Yang. Previous TV credits include: Madame Secretary, Evil, Little America, New Amsterdam and 13 Reasons Why.

Jamund Washington – Producer

Jamund Washington (producer) is a filmmaker based in NYC and Austin, TX. His producing work includes the 2016 Emmy Award nominated television film, *Silenced*, the SXSW Grand Jury Prize winner and Independent Spirit nominated, *Gimme the Loot*, and the Netflix original, *Tramps*, which he also co-wrote. Washington is an Executive Producer, Writer, and Director on the Peabody award-winning television series *Random Acts of Flyness*. Kelley Robins Hicks - Producer

Kelley Robins Hicks is a filmmaker born in Houston, TX and based in NYC. After an award winning college swimming career, she worked as an actor with work featured on Californication, Castle and the Avengers before moving to the producing side of the industry. Her film producing work has been featured at Tribeca (Queen of Glory), Toronto (Tramps) and Sundance (How to Tell You're a Douchebag) Film Festivals. She is an Executive Producer of the Peabody award winning HBO series Random Acts of Flyness and she is member of the producing team of the upcoming Warner Bros film Space Jam: A New Legacy.

Baff Akoto – Producer

Baff Akoto is an artist and filmmaker. Baff's work has exhibited at London's Institute of Contemporary Art (ICA) and British Film Institute (BFI) in their Experimental strand for "works by artists that revolutionise and reshape our vision of the cinematic moving image". Cybel Martin (cinematographer) is an award winning Director of Photography for feature films, commercials and television programs. Cybel's other camera credits include "Black as Night" a vampire film for Blumhouse that will premiere on Amazon Prime, ABC's THE ROOKIE, CBS's ALL RISE, Shonda Rhymes' FOR THE PEOPLE and Netflix's series SHE''S GOTTA HAVE IT based on the Spike Lee film. She's included in "10 Cinematographers to Watch 2020'' and Cinematographer Magazine's "Rising Stars of Cinematography, 2020". Her films have premiered at Sundance, TriBeCa, Toronto and Berlin Film Festivals. She's shot commercials for Timberland Apparel, Reebok, Sony and L'Oreal.. Cybel received her MFA from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts and is a proud member of the International Cinematographers Guild.
